



## **NOTICE OF RIGHT TO BAIL**

**as of July 1, 2006**

Georgia law gives the right of bail to youth under the jurisdiction of the Juvenile Courts. Georgia law reads as follows:

"(d) *Bail.* All children subject to the jurisdiction of the juvenile court and alleged to be delinquent or unruly shall have the same right to bail as adults; and the judge shall admit to bail all children under the courts jurisdiction in the same manner and under the same circumstances and procedures as are applicable to adults accused of the commission of crimes. Any person having legal custody or an adult blood relative or stepparent shall be entitled to post bail but shall be required immediately to return the child to the individual or entity having legal custody of the child."
